CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

The season started out as a possible watershed year with a number of changes to our Executive leadership team with Mike Woodcock (Kangas), Edwina Chappel (Junior Girls) and Julian Bish (Junior Boys) joining our ranks. Added to this, Peter Lees took over the Finance Director's role following Peter Schouten's retirement and the potential existed for an uncertain transition due solely to possible lack of experience levels. However, the quality of these new leaders, coupled with our longer serving executives, saw us collectively through another successful season that was full of highlights.

Highlights

There were many, but to name a few:

- Our Kanga numbers finished at 121, up from 90 last season, despite a flow of children to the separate U8s competition, largely as a result of the School Development Days. These involved Cherrybrook Public, Oakhill Drive, St. Agatha's, WPH Public Schools and were a tremendous success. A comment from one dad indicated his son was never confident enough to play sport until he participated in a school demonstration and after that decided to give Kanga a go.
- The energy in our Girls Competition with Edwina Chappel's leadership at Club and Association level has been outstanding.
- Our 9 Junior Semi-Finalists and 6 Grand Finalists and 3 Premiers. Another highlight was the U11's where our teams finished 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 6th in that age group.
- In Seniors, we won 4 premierships, A1, B1, C1 and C3, and were runners up in 2 others. The highlight was A1 grade winning their 3rd successive premiership.
- We also introduced new playing and training shirts that have been very popular and have added to the professional appearance of our players in all grades.
- The joint venture team involving a number of our U15s with Kenthurst was a successful relationship that showed how Clubs with a long history of playing competitively could combine to allow children from both Clubs to get a game of cricket. Congratulations to everyone involved.

West Pennant Hills Sports Club

We share a long and positive relationship with the WPH Sports Club. Apart from providing a great base for our senior cricketers to return to after games we have access to training facilities on Sports Club land and also receive annual sponsorship through their distribution to local sporting and charitable groups.

This year the relationship was taken to another level. The Sports Club agreed to help partially fund the changeover to our new playing shirts and we now proudly display the Sports Club emblem on our shirts. The Sports Club went a step further in their plans for the development of the open area that was home to our old nets. With great consideration they delayed demolishing the old nets until new nets they built were ready to be used. We now have access to quality training facilities all through the relationship that has been built over many years.

Schools Development Day

We have built strong relationships with all of our local schools over many years and where needed have invested in supporting the development of cricket facilities. This year we took it to another level due largely to the efforts of Graeme Chivers, Shaun Jackson, Mike Woodcock, Brendan Flynn and several of our senior players who helped out. This effort has built on the strong foundations we have built over many years. It gives us a wonderful opportunity to continue on this next season and further consolidate our relationships with those local schools.

Coaching

Our relationship with Dean Gilchrist's Sportspro has now entered its 4th year. This is an initiative for which we are proud to have offered our junior players. It is free of charge and there would be few clubs that offer quality professional coaching to all players. During the offseason we will look at how we can build on this worthwhile initiative.

Premierships

Our policy of Participation over Results has been in place since Geoff Newman introduced this in 1999. Premiership are always good to win but more important is that equal playing opportunity for all players irrespective of their level of ability, when judged over a full season, is valued more highly in our Club as is the enjoyment of the game by all participants. To win Junior Premierships is therefore a bonus.

Congratulations to our 9 Junior Boys teams that made the Semi Finals, our subsequent 6 Finalists and resulting 3 Premiership teams – the U11 Blue's, U12 White and U14 Gold. For our Girls we just missed out. In Seniors, we had 7 teams make the Semi Finals with 4 ultimate premiers including winning the prestigious A Grade Rofe Shield trophy for the third year in a row, a sequence only achieved by our Club once before in our 60 years in the top grade.

Presidents Award (Jim Fuggle Trophy)

Every year this Award is harder to decide given the outstanding number of volunteers who contribute so much. This year the President's Award has been awarded to Brendan Flynn. Brendan's achievements have been significant. He looked after the distribution of our new playing and training shirts for the juniors (a massive job), managed the gear and cricket ball requirements across the juniors, coached his U14 Gold side to a Premiership, co-ordinated the Sportspro coaching relationship across the Club and also found the time to take a team away to a Country Carnival.

Volunteers - Thank you

I cannot let the season go by without acknowledging all the wonderful volunteers who back up every season. To our 200 plus people who help in some active capacity – thank you.

The wonderful contribution of our volunteers was highlighted by our Kirrily Rooney and Jules White who organised the U9 Pink Stumps Day in aid of the McGrath Foundation. This is now becoming a part of our community contribution. Last season our U9's were outstanding in raising \$5,500. This year, our U9s, led by Kirrily and Jules raised just over \$6,000 – simply amazing.

Sponsors

I have mentioned our great sponsors the WPH Sports Club previously. Their financial support, willingness to be long term partners, including provision of training facilities is highly valued.

The WPH Sports Club Brasserie support for our Photo of the Month has been much appreciated. Thank you also to Kingsgrove Sports who continue to be valued long term partners.

The season is now over and we look forward to our 85th season next year with high expectations that the momentum achieved this season will be maintained.

DIRECTOR OPERATIONS

Our 84th season is now concluded and we have again had another successful season. We continue to be a significant part of the local Community by providing organised sporting opportunities for just on 670 players from Kanga to Seniors.

Since 1930/31 we have entered the following Teams:

- 806 Junior Teams
- 367 Seniors
- Registered 2,235 Kanga players (since starting in 1992/93)
- Registered 595 Girls since 1996/97

This year we entered our 800th Junior Team and set a record in registering 121 Kanga players – a record when account is taken of our U8s now playing in a separate competition.

New playing and training shirts

At the end of last season we undertook the massive task of changing to our new playing and training shirts. Work started on this just as last season ended. The process involved reviewing tenders and choosing the successful supplier – Somers. The selection of material, design and then determining sizes (short sleeve and long sleeve combinations) for over 700 players and then organising distribution is a massive task and involved over 1,000 shirts. Our Review Committee consisting of former Clothing co-ordinators (Anne Starr, Patrick Chensee, Michelle Lombard, Di Bennett) provided priceless input into design, colour combinations and materials. A further part of the process involved seeking WPH Sports Club approval to be our shirt sponsor.

A special mention to Brendan Flynn who had the great joy of having all the shirts in his lounge room and conscripting the family to sort them all in time for the start of the season.

Despite the "pain", we now have a high quality playing strip that has been well received and has received nothing but favourable feedback from all of our players, families and opposition teams.

IUNIORS' REPORT

By any measure, the 2013-14 season was a very successful one for our junior teams.

We again fielded 31 teams across all age groups from Under 8s through to Under 16s. In under 15s we didn't have enough players to form a second team so we joined with Kenthust Upper Hills club to form a combined WPHC/KUH Under 15 team. Many thanks to the KUH players and parents who enabled us to get that team on the field.

Our club's "participation over results" policy ensures our focus is on equal game time and development for all our registered junior players. This results in high levels of retention of players, as evidenced by our 17 Arthur Souter trophy recipients this season.

It is especially pleasing when, as a club, we can practice this participation ethos and still win premierships. 2013-14 was a very successful one in the U11 – U16 competition. We had 9 teams make the finals (that's almost half our U11 – U16 teams). Six teams made it to grand finals and three of those won their premierships.

Congratulations to our premiership winning U11 Blue, U12 White and U14 Gold teams. Congratulations also to Under 11 Gold, Under 13 Gold Under 15 WPHC/KUH teams who were all finalists.

There were also many outstanding individual performances within our junior ranks this season including three hattricks, seven five-fors and seven centurions.

In January Brendan Flynn led and coached a team of Under 14 players to the country carnival in Tamworth and Andrew Rickard led a team of Under 15s to the country carnival in Armidale. We are the only club invited to these carnivals, the other teams are representative level teams. That makes for tough competition compared to the Saturday comp. Despite this our U14s and U15s thoroughly enjoyed the experience (as did the parents). It gave our boys the chance to play on turf against some very formidable opposition. Thanks to Andrew and Brendan for taking these tour groups.

In February this year our Under 9 teams and parents held a Pink Stumps Day fundraiser at Cherrybrook Public School to raise money for the McGrath Foundation. Led by Kirrily Rooney and Jules White they managed to raise over \$6,000 for this terrific cause. Well done to all involved and to all those who came along and supported the cause.

Two of our major trophies presented each year to junior players are the John Coulthard Trophy (for Junior player of the year) and the Charles Booth Memorial Trophy which is award to an U13 player who not only demonstrates skills on the field but importantly plays in the true spirit of the game.

Congratulations to John Anderson who received the John Coulthard Trophy this year. His record on the field this season was impressive including 336 runs at 84 avg. (including 2 centuries) and 14 wickets at 12.79. John started with the club as a 6 year old in Kangas in 2004. He has played Shield Reps every year since Under 10s, captaining the U14 Moore Shield team and the U15 Weblin Shield team. A highlight was captaining the Weblin Shield team to win the premiership (the first time a Hornsby side had won this title since 1951-52). John also made his debut for WPHCCC A1 seniors this season, becoming the 3rd youngest player in our club's history to do so. Wow. As if that wasn't enough, he is also a great guy. This extract from the nomination received for John.

"John is well respected by his team mates and parents for his integrity; enthusiasm and true passion for the game, energy, selflessness, maturity and patience; his willingness to put the team interest before his own and his wonderful sense of humour. He is a kind and warm hearted young man."

James Woolnough received the Charles Booth Trophy. I borrow an excerpt here from the nomination received for James, which says it all.

"James has been in charge of bowling order, number of overs per bowler etc this season. He has consistently applied a criteria of inclusivity and, despite being among our top 2 or 3 bowlers himself, has frequently sacrificed his own number of overs to give more to those less adept. Despite this approach occasionally frustrating some of the other

stronger bowlers, and indeed the coach, he remains popular throughout the playing cohort and I would say is one of those kids who act as glue within the teams internal relationships. It does him no harm whatsoever that he is also unfailingly polite towards, and articulate in the company of, the parents present. Just a good egg."

Thanks to all of you in the touring party who helped me and I hope to see you in Taree if we can score an invite.


