CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

Our 61st Season is now over and we have had yet another very successful season:

Junior Club Champions for the 5th time in 6 years

Senior Club Champions 5 times in succession

Our Juniors were represented in all Age Divisions for the first time in Association history with our U11's having both teams playing off in the Final. Congratulations to our U11 Gold, U14 White and U15 Blue teams. To our Runners up, U11 Green, U12 Red (lost by 9 runs), U13 Golds (1 wicket) and U16 Blues (1 run in the last over).

Similarly, our Seniors had an outstanding season with 5 Teams making the Semi Finals and our Colts winning their first Premiership.

Congratulations

One of the major highlights of the season was achievements off the field.

The Association recently elected 2 of our West Penno Women as Patrons of the Association; Denise Annetts (Anderson), former Australian Women's cricket great and Lisa Sthalekar, current Vice-Captain of the Australian Women's team and one of the elite world players.

Denise played for the Seniors and Coaches the U13 Blue side this year.

Lisa played all her Junior cricket with us from U10s to U16s. Lisa also won the prestigious Belinda Clarke award as the Outstanding NSW Women's Cricketer of the Year Award for the 2nd time in succession.

They join a distinguished short list of the Mayors of Hornsby, Ku-ring-gai and Baulkham Hills and two Life Members in this role. Well done ladies – we are proud of your achievements having 2 of the biggest names in World cricket part of our Club.

Congratulations also to Ross Anderson who was awarded the inaugural Cricket NSW (Northern) Volunteer of the Year Award.

Participation over results

Winning Junior Premiership trophies is always good but it is not the reason that drives us – we judge our success by the number of players backing up to play next season rather than the number of trophies we may win. I received an email exchange between parents from our U11 Gold Premiership winning side – this says it all:

"...I was just about to delete this email, but thought that you & the Club Committee might like to know that the Clubs policy of participation above results is not just a platitude, as can be gleaned from some of the parents comments from the victorious WPHCCC U11 Gold team below."

A note from another parent:

".....Yes to confirm what everyone else has said. The stats of the match ...showed it all that no one was over-bowled, everyone had equal opportunity to bat and everyone had at least 2 overs (against a quality batsman who must have been the best we have encountered).

We won because every boy has been taught to play cricket and has been given the opportunity to do so. A Champion team."

In the Seniors, our C2 Captain wrote:

"...the decision to play as many players as possible in the semi and final was the right one, and my thanks goes out once again to those players who were prepared to play ½ games only to give other players a chance."

Congratulations to Deepak and his outstanding Junior Committee that has continued the tradition of exceptional leadership in the Juniors over a number of years.

Kanga

The Kanga programme continues to be a tremendous success. This season we registered 101 players with 51 children 'graduating' to U9s next season – each team already established with Managers, Coaches, Assistant Coaches and gear stewards. The value of this programme can be seen from the longer term results – 10 of our Premiership Colts having come from Kanga and 7 A1 Graders. The continued leadership and enthusiasm of John Coulthard, Glen O'Connor and Ben Frawley have been superb.

Volunteers - Thank you

The level of volunteer participation continues to be staggering and is another of the main reasons that sustains our Club. When we add up all the jobs volunteers do – Coaching, Managing, scoring, umpiring, managing gear, Divisional management roles plus club Executive structure we have between 210 and 220 people volunteering.

Dominic Thornely – Dominic Thornely took on the role of Club Ambassador for the 4th year in succession. Dom is always tremendous around the children and for him to turn up to our Presentation Day on the same day that he signed a contract to play with Sachin Tendulkar in the Twenty/20 IPL competition was tremendous.

President's Award (Jim Fuggle Trophy) – for off-field services to the Club

When this Award was started in 1983/84 we have seen some worthy names winning this Award since – people who were always there. The winner this year is **Glen O'Connor**, who has given tremendous support to John Coulthard in running our Kanga programme despite a number of heavy personal commitments.

Once again we have been well supported by our sponsors to whom we are very grateful: West Pennant Hills Sports Club and Kingsgrove Sports have been very good long term sponsors.

Overview

By any measure, our Club has been successful over a number of years. However, there are issues that need attention.

Our Girls dropped to 1 team this season and forfeited a number of games. We have perhaps one more chance to turn this around. Rebuilding the Girls in 2008-09 is one of our top priorities.

Thanks again to the many volunteers who make this Club great. A special thanks to my fellow Executive members on their continued superb efforts.

Kanga

Kanga is the lifeblood of our Club. While John Coulthard's Report has full details there are many highlights. This year we registered 101 children – our 1,491st child so next year we will register our 1,500th child since starting in 1992/93. Some other really interesting facts about our Kanga programme:

- Last season we registered 7 teams in the U9s sustained by 54 Kanga graduates
- Our A1 side has 7 Kanga graduates and our Premiership Colts side had 10 players who started in Kanga
- Added to this are the many players with Northern Districts who came through Kanga

The success John and his team (Glenn O'Connor and Ben Frawley) have had over the last couple of years has been simply amazing.

Girls

This year was a difficult one with only 1 team and the added difficulty of fielding a team regularly. This has provided the catalyst for us to rethink our approach to Girls cricket and a strategy has already been prepared and is being implemented. We are quietly confident that we can rebuild the Girls to again to a critical mass. On a more positive note, congratulations to Felicity Trinh who was selected in the Emerging Breakers.

Juniors

Deepak's Report as Director – Juniors accompanies this Report. In addition to the highlights covered in this Report:

- Our 32 teams is the equal highest number we have registered equalling the 2000-01 results
- The Club and Association record of having all Divisions represented by a WPHC team (with 2 in the U11s) in the finals is a record to be proud of, especially in the context of our Participation Over Results Policy'
- Next season we will register our 600th Junior team currently 583.5 teams have represented WPHC.

There have also some outstanding individual achievements:

- Michael Richards:
 - o His 7/2 (bowling off-spin) against Mt Colah (U15 Blue) is the best Club bowling performance for anyone who has taken 7 wickets in an innings in either Juniors or Seniors
 - Michael later backed up and took 4/6 on his Seniors bowling debut with 4/6 playing C1 from
 6.5 overs another record. This time the best bowling debut by a Junior playing Seniors
- *Siddarth Sethi* (U13 Blue) had match figures (Vs WPHC Green) of 4/2 and 6/5 (10/7) which is the best ever 10 wickets bowling performance in a match by anyone in our history.
- Daniel Anderson (U13 Blue 2008 12 years and 9 months) has the best all-round debut by a Junior playing Seniors. Daniel playing C1 top scored for the match with 22 (coming in at 7/42). Playing D2 the next week, he took 4/22 also the best bowling performance of the match.

Tamworth Tour

A special mention to our combined U13 and U14 teams (minus Rep players at other Carnivals) who represented WPHC at the Tamworth January carnival. In response to a request from the organizers we were invited to fill a gap left by another team that could not participate. Congratulations to the team. While not winning any games, they were competitive and the Organisers are keen to invite us back next season. Well done fella's.

Tim made his debut in 2000/01 and has since taken over 200 wickets and scored over 1,000 runs. One of the good guys in our Club and a great Team man. Another 'retiree' who may well find his way back after a few years.

Phil Hando (C2)

Phil Hando is a relative newcomer who starting playing Seniors in 2005-06 but he was involved heavily with the Kanga's as a parent but even more importantly as a Volunteer. Phil goes to South Africa for 3 years with his employer and our best wishes are with you.

Peter Westerberg – on fire

How about Peter Westerberg (D2). After hitting his first ever 6 earlier this year he backs it up with his first ever wicket. After 76 matches, and 9 overs he now has an average – won't mention what it is to protect the innocent. Some facts about this achievement:

- Peter dismissed the Opener and & top scorer, Henry Liang for 39
- According to Peter 'In fairness to the batsman, he had only recently returned to the crease, having suffered a concussion and was probably not batting at all well at the time'
- When coming on to bowl P.K.W. was heard to warn the scorers to sharpen their pencils timely advice, as it proved!

Separated at birth

Mention has been made a few times about one of our former greats - big Dale 'Merv' Armstrong (3,709 career runs). Merv and Greg Fiedler went to the West Indies for the World Cup. It was mentioned recently that Desmond Haynes went across to Merv to catch-up on old times. We now have photographic evidence to prove that story that 'Merv' is a double to Merv Hughes. A record double.

After rule changes this year allowed players to play in 2 grades on the same weekend (Saturday and Sunday games) *Nick Bennett* (Colts) not only played for A2 but also Colts. In one match on Saturday he scored 60* and 77* the next day. So Nick not only becomes our first player to back up but also became the first player in the Association to get back to back 50's. Great effort mate.

What about this for commitment

How about our D2's. Yet to win a game but getting so close to turning around the season they played out most of their innings in driving rain. As Peter Westerberg says:

"I have not seen such commitment to play out a match in spite of the elements since Round 14 of 2003-04, at Glenhaven, when we were playing for a last chance to make the semi finals while our opponents, Hornsby were playing for the minor premiership. On that occasion I recall players drying out their whites during the drinks break on the gas barbecue: with some alarming results. Today the game was not finally abandoned until the pitch was actually under water!"

Fast scoring – another record

In A2 *Ronan Barrett* (A2) hit 6 fours in succession in one over to win the game. It is the first time any WPH player has hit this number of fours off an over.

Matt Scoular (Colts) hit a Club record of 32 off an over – eight 4s! Now this is special. The bowler bowled an eight ball over (2 no balls) and every ball was hit for a boundary. How about this for a record:

- It is the highest number of runs ever scored in a single over by a West Penno player in 62 years
- Previous records (Ronan's aside) were sprinkled with 6s but not this one.

This is an amazing achievement – the like of which we may never see again. Well done Matt.

"It's not fair"

In a C1 game, our one stage we had our 'height challenged' 12 year old (Daniel Anderson) and 14 year old (Michael Richards) batting together and doing it well. The Pymble first change bowler was about 190 cms and kept bouncing the boys. Problem was that he was being called for 'no balls' (bowling that is) as the ball was clearly going over their heads. The bowler then made a comment to the umpire that 'it wasn't fair'.

Confidence

Got to hand it to Bran Ramachandran (D2). After being so used to batting reasonably quickly (he bats at 10) Bran was all padded up ready to go in. Problem was that we were only chasing 55 and we passed them 1 wicket down after a 50 run opening partnership. Good one Bran.

Our most remarkable debut

An amazing biological event happened last Saturday (26th January) in the C1 White game against Pymble. Daniel Anderson (12 years of age) has the Association record for being the youngest player ever to play in this Association. On Saturday he made his debut as a Registered player when he played C1. Why is this special? He last played Seniors, 2 months before he was born (and prior to having a name) when his mother fielded 7 months pregnant in a B1 Semi Final – filling in for a player who was absent. His debut 12 years later now concludes this remarkable double debut! He also top scored for the match with 22.

Finals

Day 1

Colts 275 defeated Berowra 124

Day 1

The lads did what they needed to do on a beautiful batting track at Storey Park. Sujith Dissanayake with 98 was superb and got fabulous backup from Tim Scoular with 53 and Nick Bennett 39. We got the runs quickly and then had 21 overs at Berowra who are in trouble. Dylan Brogan has 2/13 and the killer blow came 2 run-outs – one by Mark Bennett with a direct hit from side on. We are well on the way to winning our first Colts premiership.

Day 2

As expected, we continued on from the 5/49 overnight and had a comprehensive to win to takeout our first Colts Premiership. The guys just steamrolled Berowra. Dylan Brogan was outstanding, taking 5/17 from 14 overs and got great support from Nick Bennett and Tim Scoular with 1 wicket each plus the 2 run-outs from Saturday. The fantastic win against a good side.

C1 White 141 and 90 <u>lost outright (after leading first innings)</u> Hornsby 123 and 146 <u>Day 1</u>

This was always going to be a tough game for both sides on a difficult wicket that had a lot of late sideways movement. We bowled and fielded brilliantly but still had a challenging run chase. Geoff Richards with 3/18, John Steel 3/14, Andrew Watt 2/29 and Ben McNamara 2/49 were outstanding. Our turn to bat against a strong attack. At 6/45 we were struggling. Enter Michael McDowell (33) and Geoff Richards (45*) and we got an invaluable lead.

Day 2

This was always going to be a tough day 2 on a substandard wicket with 2 strong bowling sides. Continuing on at 2/31 they got away early but superb bowling by Geoff Richards (3/40) and Ben McNamara (5/72) restricted them to a gettable 129 target. Geoff was unbelievable with 10 overs of bowling despite a strained thigh muscle and bowling on a shortened run. Added to this John Steel who bowled with a hamstring strain and it was an amazing effort to restrict them. Batting a second time we lost early wickets again to be 3/10 but enter Michael McDowell 30 and Tony Hadley 28 and at 3/60 we were well in it. Then some good bowling with the odd rogue ball and we lost key wickets. All up, a close game (29 run loss over 4 innings) but a fantastic season by the boys who took out the Minor Premiership.

Day 1

Playing at Greenway Park we are chasing what is gettable score. Teams need to score between 250 and 300+ to post a competitive score on this deck. DIRECTOR - JUNIORS REPORT

It gives me great pleasure to present my annual report in this tenth edition of the West Pennant Hills-Cherrybrook Cricket Club Year Book. After a break from traditions last season, the Club has been crowned once again as Club Champions.

The 2007/08 season represents 61 years of the Club's existence. This season has seen an unprecedented increase in enrolments and the most successful season of all times when 7 teams across all age groups played in the finals.

In terms of registrations, 389 players were registered in 32 teams as follows:

- Under 9-7 teams
- Under 10 5 teams
- Under 11 5 teams
- Under 12 4 teams
- Under 13 4 teams
- Under 14 3 teams
- Under 15 2 teams
- Under 16 2 teams

This represented an increase of 3 additional teams on the previous season. We expect the growth in player registrations to continue as there is an increase in Kanga registrations in the past few seasons. The Kanga Program under the guidance of John Coulthard and the management team continues to flourish. The enthusiasm and professionalism with which the Kanga Program runs continues to attract and retain young Cricketers with the Club. A special thank you goes to John and his team for another successful year.

The 2007/08 will go down in the Club's history as one of the most successful. Between the Under 11 and Under 16 age groups there were six competitions. Of the 12 teams playing in the finals a total of 7 were West Pennant Hills-Cherrybrook teams. This is a record for the Club. Two U11 WPHCCC teams played each other in the final while we had representations in every age group from U12 to U16. The Club was rewarded with three premierships. Congratulations to our Premiership teams: Under 11 Gold, Under 14 White and Under 15 Blue. Congratulations also to the members of the Under 11 Green, U12 Red, U13 Gold and U16 White teams for their performance as runners-up.

Despite all of these successes it must be highlighted that they were achieved in an environment that encourages "Participation Over Results". Indeed, this principle is emphasised in our Preferred Playing Code and will continue to be. The Club continues to encourage the concept of "balanced teams" where player participation is encouraged and team spirit is nurtured.

Due to a gap left by another team that could not participate, WPHCCC were requested to participate in the Tamworth Cricket Carnival. A combined U13 and U14 team represented the Club at this carnival. We are hopeful that we will be able to secure an invitation at next seasons' carnival.

Due to their finishing positions at the conclusion of the rounds the two teams played each other in the Semi Final with the White team prevailing in a tight contest. Parneet had also previously claimed 5/9 earlier in the season.

Due to the extremely wet weather that plagued the season several matches were washed out and batting conditions were generally difficult. As a consequence there were no centuries recorded by players in these teams. There were also no additional five wickets in an innings performances. However, statistically, the following players were outstanding in their respective teams:

Accordingly I wish to express my appreciation to David Flook, Bill Byrnes, Tony Brain and Geoff Starr who all played key roles in the team's coaching and management over the years and also to all of the dedicated parents associated with this wonderful team.

I would also like to recognise Daniel Brain, Harpreet Singh and Christy Doran for their selection for Green Shield in the 2007/08 season (for Mosman, Western Suburbs and North Sydney respectively). Further, it is with pleasure that I can report on the achievements of Daniel and Harpreet in gaining recognition as being amongst the top players in Sydney in this age group through their selection in the Green Shield 1st Eleven.

Finally, to cap an absolutely outstanding season, Daniel Brain was not only the West Pennant Hills – Cherrybrook Junior Player of the Year, he also won the Association's prestigious Kookaburra Rising Star Award. Congratulations Daniel on a season that brought the results and recognition that you so richly deserve.
