## **Association Grounds**

The grounds we play on are among the best in NSW. The history of some of them is recorded below:

11/9/1913	Thornleigh Oval Built on the site of 4 acres of Thornleigh Recreation Reserve in 1898. 1947/48	Headen Park Named after Cr Harry Headen Shire President 1954-60. Previously called Fellowship Park, it was once part of a dairy and owned by the Presbyterian Church.	•	27/3/1994 – Jim Fuggle (B1) played his 500 <sup>th</sup> game for the Club and top scored with 55 Greg Fiedler (A2 23/11/02) brought up his 5,000 runs for the Club Vs Beecroft with a "booming cover drive that squirted through mid wicket" to quote Greg.  John Howard – our former Prime Minister played A2 (1960's) and misjudged a high catch (Southern end) and ended up in a blackberry bush. He had to be extricated.
1947/48	Vernon Street Oval Used as a dumpsite for damaged trees after the great storm damage in January 1991.		
1952/53	Campbell Park Constructed on land given to the Cricket Club by Mr Campbell who had the sloping block running from New Farm Road. WPHCC levelled the ground and built the fencing. The 1952/53 Association Annual Report commented: "A fine spirit of self help is being shown by WPH. They have guaranteed that they will construct the wicket and lay water onto the ground as well as providing enough chain wire to fence the banked up section. A truly grand effort." It was used for the 1956/57 A1 Grade Final.	•	B1 Vs Perseverance ( <b>Final</b> ) in 1967/68 were all out for 4 runs! A Club and Association record. Rob Gailey (C1 1991/92) scored 205 (our 3 <sup>rd</sup> highest score) after having a hip and knee replacement. This is the 2 <sup>nd</sup> highest score by a WPH player behind the 225 scored by Kevin Smith in 1956/57.
1953	Storey Park. The Oval is the site of a brickwork's (pre Great War). It was then the site of Fowlers Pottery works (earthenware/pipe manufacturers). The ground was named after Cr Sid Storey – the 9 <sup>th</sup> Shire President.	•	Ken Donaldson took a Club record 16 wickets in a match Vs Pymble C&S Vs Pymble 1978/79 (9/34 and 7/72)  24/3/2002 – Darryl Daniels (C1) Final Vs Normanhurst took 8/74 off 32 overs  16/11/2002 – Peter Whitehead (A1 scored 100* and then took 7/52 against Mt Colah on the one day. This made him the first player in the Association to achieve this feat.  2002/03 Association record 4th wicket partnership 223 Glen Percival (117) and Simon Davies (112) Vs ARL (Semi Final)  28/10/2007 Colts – Taylor Paton (106*) & Nick Bennett (103*) Association record 4th wicket partnership 183* for Colts. 1955/56	Galston Park – now Hayes Oval An earlier ground was in use throughout the 1890s. The current ground also had a trotting track. In 1951/52 members of the Association and Hills District cleared all trees from the land. It was first used in competition in 1955/56. The ground was greatly enlarged in the early 1980's.	B2 Blue (24/1/2004). Playing Kenthurst we lost 9 wickets all bowled. The 10 <sup>th</sup> wicket was run-out!
1962/63	Mt Ku-ring-gai Oval Mt Ku-ring-gai was a former rubbish tip.	o Ronan Barrett (A2 on 12/1/2008 Vs Galston-Glenorie) hit 4 sixers in the 16 <sup>th</sup> over to win the game − a Club record number in one over.  • 1994/95 B1 Grade Semi Final (Mt Kuring-gai) we were a player down through injury. Denise Annetts (Anderson), recently retired Women's Test Cricket star, fielded at deep square leg − 7 months pregnant. Her son (to be born) Daniel thereby became the youngest player in the Association's history − 2 months before birth!  Sequel  • On Saturday 26 <sup>th</sup> January 2008 in the C1 White game against Pymble, <i>Daniel Anderson</i> (12 years of age) played as a Senior registered player. His debut 12 years later concludes this remarkable double debut! How did he go − he scored 22 and top scored for the match.
1962/63	Montview Oval Developed on the site of an old tip. The Eastern pitch was built in 1962/63 and the Western oval in 1987/88.	1994/95 Montview (East) Oval, Eric Junkkari (B1) batting last with the team 9 down and one over to go was told by his Captain (Jim Fuggle) to take no chances and play for a draw. Eric decided to hit the opening bowler last ball of the match straight over the bowler's head for 6 to win the game.      2001/02 – D2 Montview (West), Graeme Hunt took 8/38 Vs Hornsby     23/9/06 Tim Connell (B2) took a double hat-trick Vs Hornsby

1994/95	Edward Bennett Oval Used for Juniors only since 1985/86 and Kanga since 1992/93.	October 1993 – Kanga cricket made its debut at this Oval having started at Pennant Hills Oval a year earlier.
1993/94	Greenway Park WPHCCC B1 Grade (Jim Fuggle's team) played the first Senior match at the ground. Pennant Hills Oval	The 1995/96 B2 Final (Captained by Les Watkins) is one of the best. After Hornsby scored 295, WPHCCC began the run chase with 81 overs available. After being 2 for 2 we eventually won by 1 wicket with the last man in (Peter Rakebrandt) who scored two first ball ducks in his last two innings, batting for 5 overs to support Paul Mullinger (80* with Paul 'out' twice off no-balls) who hit the winning runs.	

WPH Public School	14/2/2004 – Daniel Anderson (38*) and Sid Sethi (31*) set a record across any Grade – putting on 71 in 4 overs (26 balls) as the fastest partnership over 50 in Club History.
Warrina St, Berowra	A2, Andrew Driscoll 2004/05 bowled a ball that landed first bounce at fine leg. This is our worst recorded delivery.
